Bullying

It is always important that we really define what bullying is.

Bullying is defined in the National Safe Schools Framework as:

*An ongoing misuse of power in relationships through **repeated** verbal, physical and/or social behaviour that causes physical and/or psychological harm. It can involve an individual or a group misusing their power over one or more persons. Bullying can happen in person or online, and it can be obvious (overt) or hidden (covert). Bullying of any form or for any reason can have long-term effects on those involved, including bystanders.*

***Single** incidents and conflicts or fights between equals, whether in person or online are not defined as bullying. However, these conflicts still need to be addressed and resolved.*

As part of our Child Protection units in PDHPE, that is how we teach and address bullying.

-  Be aware of activities and move slowly around the room.

The Benefits of Play-based learning...

At OOSH, our children might look like they are always playing but there is some serious learning going on at the same time! Play is an important teaching tool. Through play, children learn how to interact with others and develop lifelong skills.

There are 6 benefits of play-based learning –

Physical - Active play is critical for children’s physical development. It helps with co-ordination, gross and fine motor skills, is excellent for burning up energy and promotes better eating and sleeping habits.

Emotional - The magic of play enables children to create an imaginary world, take on different personas and act out stories. This helps them to express and regulate their feelings.

Social - Co-operative play helps children with their social skills, negotiate group dynamics, recognise and respond to other’s feelings, share, show affection, resolve conflicts and adhere to the rules.

Cognitive - Self-directed play gives children the chance to hone their decision-making skills. When children are faced with a problem during play, it gives them a chance to test their reasoning and judgement, and their ability to find a solution.

Creativity - Play really gives children a chance to let their imagination run wild and create worlds of their own. A game or a craft activity provides a child the freedom to explore new possibilities and think outside the box.

Communication - By playing with others, children learn the art of communication. By listening, observing, recognising facial expressions and body language, they figure out how to strike up and carry on conversations and how to express their thoughts and desires.

As you can see, play is a very important part of growing up!



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
