

Attendance at School

It is important that children are here before the school bell at the start of the day. If they are not in their classroom when the roll is marked, they will be marked absent and they must go to the office for a late note so that the roll and attendance can be changed. In the afternoon, if children are leaving early, they MUST go to the office first to have an early note attached to the roll before they go to their parents who are waiting outside the gate. Attendance rolls are legal documents.

On the 1st October, Sophia T went to B.Coloured Salon in Dural, which is a sustainable salon. They donate hair to local wig makers and charities such as the Variety Charity, to make wigs for people with medically induced hair loss such as alopecia or those undergoing cancer treatment.

Year One Excursion to Brewongle

On Monday the 14th of September, Year One went on excursion to Brewongle Environmental Education Centre to further our knowledge about the Geography unit of "Features of Places" that we studied in term three.

When we arrived at Brewongle EEC we were shown the beautiful old Habitat Tree, with all its wrinkles and sags. We spent the day being guided through activities to learn about the Habitat Tree and it's surroundings; all the plants and animals that use it for food and shelter.

To start with, we went into a classroom called the "Earth Lab". Here we were shown the taxidermies of various animals found in the environment around the education centre.

Next, we got to explore the different kinds of Nest Boxes that belonged to various animals in the bush. Our guide used an extended pole camera and we used hand-held screens linked to the camera to peek at who was living in the box. We all had a close up view of the inhabitant of the nest boxes. The baby possum was very cute!

After sighting the nest boxes, we enjoyed a walk around the sight while spotting some of the educational centre's wildlife cameras. The guide discussed the types of food they use as bait and what animals might visit the spots that these cameras were placed.

We then viewed footage from the wildlife cameras to identify the animals which had been using the Habitat Tree when no one was looking.

Finally, it was time for a leaf litter bug hunt at the Yarning Circle. We discussed what lives beneath the soil of the Habitat Tree. It was so much fun searching for bugs in the leaf litter and soil. We shared exactly where we had found the bug and how the features of the bug might determine where in lives before creating a habitat for the bug/s we found.

Before we left we made a journey stick to take home and we learnt about the six Aboriginal seasons, comparing these to the four modern seasons.

We had a lovely day out at Brewongle Environmental Education Centre.





School Travel - Term 4 2020

Stay up to date with Opal and ticketing changes for school travel



2021 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened on Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now apply online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should re-apply or update their details.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

Applications need to be submitted before **31 December 2020** to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a School Student Transport Scheme or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator, this may be distributed via the school or sent direct to their address. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/Parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.
