

## ROBOTICS AT DURAL PUBLIC SCHOOL



The STEMSHARE initiative is a fully funded program run by the Department of Education that endeavours to give public schools the opportunity to use a range of technology tools and equipment. The STEMSHARE program allows schools to hire technology kits for a term, providing students with the opportunity to engage in innovative ways of learning. STEM education is the learning of science, technology, engineering and mathematics in an interdisciplinary or integrated approach.

This term Dural Public School have been exploring the STEMSHARE PC Robotics kit. This kit includes 10x OZOBots, 10x Makey Makey circuits, 10x Microbits and 10x EV3 Mindstorm kits. This has allowed our teachers to explore different ways robotics and coding can be integrated into key learning areas in the classroom, including mathematics, science and even music! At Dural Public School we are lucky enough to have six Blue Bots that are used K-4 for coding as well as four EV3 Lego Mindstorm robots that are used by our Stage 3 Robotics Team. We are loving using the additional robotics kits to help empower our students to be future focused thinkers, ubiquitous learners and collaborative team members!

We are excited to see our students starting to explore and experiment with these kits as they use their computer literacy, coding, science, maths, collaboration and communication skills. We have this kit on loan until Week 7 of Term 4. Over the next few weeks we will include snapshots of how students are using these incredible technology resources in their classrooms!



Year 2 have been using the OZOBots to explore lifecycles. As a class they explored the life cycle of a frog, coding the robot to complete a different action at each stage of the life cycle.

"My life cycle is about a ladybird. Ladybirds can lay up to 40 eggs at a time! We made a life cycle of the ladybird and the Ozobot travelled around the cycle. First the ladybug lays its eggs and then they hatch. Its my first time using OZOBots! The best thing about it was drawing the pictures and making the OZOBot follow along the track. My favourite was the nitro boost which made it go a little bit faster!" Lachlan, 2C





"My life cycle is about a red back spider. A female spider can weigh up to 100 times more than a male spider! The mum lays lots of eggs and the spider grows an exoskeleton. Then it grows bigger and likes to bite things! We put the OZOBot on the track and made it travel around the spider shapes as well as the life cycle. We added "fast" and "spin" to our track by adding green and red to our black line. We also added tornado which made the OZOBot spin around lots of times, getting faster and faster each time." — Hazel, 2C

Students will need to prepare and deliver a 1-2 minute speech to their House on why they should be a House Captain in 2021.


