#### **Kindergarten Enrolments**

Applications to enrol for Kindergarten at Dural Public School in 2021 are now open. If you, or someone that you know, is looking to enrol a child into Kindergarten next year, enrolment forms can be lodged online.

If possible, parents are asked to use the online enrolment system. At this stage, the online system will only accept enrolment applications from 'in-area' families. Paper applications are also available, and can be lodged, at the front office.

### Special Family Circumstances

Any changes to your child's family situation can impact on their emotional, social and academic well-being. It is always a good idea to inform your child's teacher, an Assistant Principal, and/or me about any changed circumstances so that the child can be supported if necessary. Examples of special circumstances include the birth of a sibling, family illness, separation and divorce or the death of a loved one and especially for primary aged children, illness of a pet.

Please notify the office staff if there has been any change in your contact details. This includes address details, email address and telephone numbers. If we need to contact you urgently it is important that we have the correct details. This is especially important as often we have sick children who need to go home.

# The Tell Them From Me student survey (Term 3, 2020)

### Information for parents and carers

Centre for Education Statistics and Evaluation

This term our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them Econg Me* student feedback survey. Students in years 4, 5 and 6 will complete the voluntary survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

You may remember that our students also participated in a *Tell Them Econ Me* student survey in Term 3 last year. Asking students to complete this survey yearly allows us to identify trends in student responses as well as track engagement and motivation across grades.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used *Tell Them Econy Me* to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school and will inform the direction we head in for our new School Improvement Plan for 2021-2024.

The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 10 August and 23 October. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

A consent form and FAQs for parents/carers about the survey is being sent home with students and is available on our school website. If you <u>do not</u> want your child or children to participate, please return the form to school by **Friday 28<sup>th</sup> August 2020**.

### Year 4 Excursion to Brewongle

The musty grey rocks crunched under our feet as the class scrambled out of the bus, aware of the learning adventure that awaited us. A spark of excitement suddenly hit us.....

We were at Brewongle to learn about the past origins of the original inhabitants of this land, the Aboriginals. It was an interesting experience that started with the two mesmerised classes sitting around a campfire, with Sue, our Aboriginal guide introducing us to the multipurpose tools the Aboriginals sustainably made from traded, or gathered materials. Later, Steve and Kate took us on a fun educational bushwalk to explain what plants and resources the Aboriginals used.

Then we walked to the lookout near the Hawksbury River where our eyes could have been gazing on for days. Suddenly, we heard a scream. 'LUKE. LUKE!!! Stop it!' the quartet of boys fell backwards off the log. There was hysterical laughter. Sue even said that was nearly video worthy!

Sue showed the class how to use ochre (a combination of a special type of grinded rock mixed with water) to paint on their arms and legs to create their own Aboriginal Dreamtime Stories. After everyone had finished painting themselves, the girls took the clapsticks and the boys got up and started to dance the 'Bouncing Kangaroo'. There was laughter from every girl as the boys hopped about, hopelessly trying to imitate a kangaroo. Next, it was the girls' turn. They were acting as a mob of female emus as the boys used the clapsticks to tap out the beat. We had quick lunch stop and on to the next activity.

The Sand Art story was REALLY fun and the conclusion of our day. Steve told the story of the little boy who was looking for his true love. Every now and then, he would asked a question like: 'Who can tell me what two is in the native language?' or 'What do you think is number one thousand, seven hundred and forty five is.' Then he asked us who we thought the little boy was with a smug smile. (It was him! And he told us that his true love was Nessie the blue tongue lizard they kept at the education centre).

Now THAT, was the fantastically great Brewongle excursion.



## 6S TERRARIUM SCIENCE ACTIVITY

As an extension to their science unit and a special interest project 6S engaged in a lesson on terrariums. Within this lesson they learnt about how to make a self-sufficient eco-system and the needs of certain types of plants. They were then given the opportunity to create their very own terrarium in class and experience some of the challenges in the task and problem solving required to overcome them. Some of the feedback was –

"We are going to see the water evaporate and rain back onto the plant so you don't have to water it. It also sometimes gets misty on the glass" – Megan
