Dear Parents/ Caregivers,

This letter is to outline the details and give information about the Year 5 Point Wolstoncroft Sport and Recreation Centre Camp. <u>Details are as follows:</u>

Dates: Monday 8th March to Friday 12th March, 2021.

Travel times: We will travel by coach leaving Dural Public School on Monday 8th March at approx <u>9.00am</u> and will return on the Friday afternoon 12th March approx 3.00pm.

Where: Point Wolstoncroft Camp is on a peninsula in Lake Macquarie at Gwandalan, approached through Wyong.

Program Details: The program is conducted by the NSW Office of Sport and Recreation staff, assisted by our own teachers. It involves environmental education using the natural environment of the camp, social education and a wide variety of recreation activities. Students benefit enormously from the camp and return with new knowledge and skills. All lessons are taken by trained and competent staff assisted by our own teachers attending.

Accommodation: Students are accommodated in clean lodges, most of which are new buildings. They are expected to shower daily and hygiene is part of the Camp routine. Dural teachers supervise students at night and sleep in lodges attached to the student lodges. Permanent staff are trained in First Aid, C.P.R. (as are our teachers), E.A.R. and use of oxygen equipment.

Meals: Meals are prepared by staff trained to cater for dietary needs of participants and are balanced to provide energy and nutrition. Any medication is also to be labelled and will be kept by staff for administration.

Payment: This will be included in the Term 1 Invoice.

What to pack

<u>Luggage</u>

One piece of luggage, a sleeping bag and a small day backpack is recommended per child. These should be clearly marked with your child's name, address and phone number.

Shorts and t-shirts (no singlets, sleeveless or midriff tops) Jeans Jumpers and tracksuit pants Socks and underwear Raincoat Pyjamas Swimming costume and rashie shirt Sunscreen, sun hat and sunglasses Two pairs of running shoes (one old pair to wear in the water) Toiletries, soap, deodorant, lip balm and insect repellent (no aerosols) Two towels Pillow, sleeping bag or doona and two single flat sheets (linen needs to be provided for hygiene purposes) Day backpack Paper, pens or pencils Plastic bags for dirty or wet clothes Medication (if required) Handkerchief or tissues Water bottle **Optional** Camera What NOT to bring Aerosol Thongs Mobile phones Computer/video games Lollies or chocolate Jewellery Money Anything valuable Staying in touch during camp While at camp, you can stay in touch with your child by fax or email. Year 5 Point Wolstoncroft Camp **Dural PS Code of Conduct**

Excursions are an extension of the classroom and therefore you must behave appropriately at all times.

On the Coach:

- 1. Never board or leave the coach unless instructed to do so by a teacher or coach captain.
- 2. While the coach is in motion remain seated properly and keep your seatbelt buckled.
- 3. Do not distract the coach captain whilst the coach is in motion by talking to him, making unnecessary movement or loud noises.
- 4. Remain in your seat when the coach stops until you are told what to do.
- 5. Do not play with air flow and seat controls.
- 6. If you feel travel sick let a teacher know QUICKLY.
- 7. Keep the same seat and 'buddy' at all times.
- 8. Keep the coach clean and litter free.
- 9. No food or drink is to be consumed on the coach unless otherwise instructed.
- 10. At Point Wolstoncroft all lollies and chocolates are confiscated immediately.

At the Accommodation: At Point Wolstoncroft

- 1. Respect the needs and comfort of other guests.
- 2. Respect property.
- 3. You are responsible for your belongings. Keep your luggage tidy: name all your clothing.
- 4. You are responsible for your room. It must be kept clean, tidy and treated with respect.
- 5. All facilities are for sharing. Be cooperative.
- 6. After 'Lights Out' you will stay in bed. You will remain quietly in your room.
- 7. Behave in an exemplary manner at all times.

Meal Times:

- 1. Remember your manners.
- 2. Make conversation with members of your table.
- 3. Ask permission to leave when everyone at your table has finished. You will be permitted to leave by a teacher.
- 4. You are responsible for leaving your table clean.
- 5. Complete duties as rostered and as required.
- 6. Be helpful.

At Camp:

- 1. Always listen and follow the instructions of the Camp instructors, Dural teachers and coach captains.
- 2. Speak politely and listen carefully to everyone.
- 3. Behave in an exemplary manner at all times: you are representing Dural P.S.

Mobile Phones: Under no circumstances are mobile phones to be brought to camp.

Failure to comply with any of these rules may result in your parents being asked to collect you from the camp and take you home.
