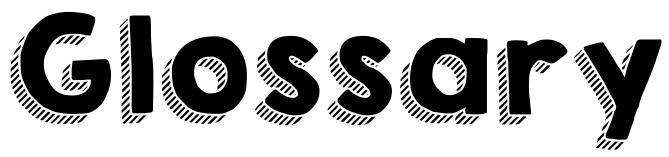


Phoneme	The sound that a letter makes. E.g. /c/-/a/-/t/ All sounds are referred to as phonemes.
Grapheme	A letter or multiple letters that represent a sound. E.g. /a/, /s/, /sh/, /oa/, /ch/
Syllable	The different beats in words. Each syllable usually contains a vowel and one or more consonants. E.g. monkey = mon-key
Segment	A way to break down a word into phonemes. E.g. dog = /d/ /o/ /g/ chip= /ch/ /i/ /p/
Blend	Joining individual sounds to make a word. e.g. /d/ /o/ /g/ = dog.
Fluency	The ability to read with accuracy, speed and expression. In order for students to understand what they read, they must be able to read fluently.
Short vowel	The sound the vowel makes /a/, /e/, /i/, /o/ and /u/
Long vowel	A vowel name pronounced the same way as the letter name itself. E.g. ay, ai, ee, ea, ie, y, oa, ow, ue, ew. a_e igh, i_e o_e u_e



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
